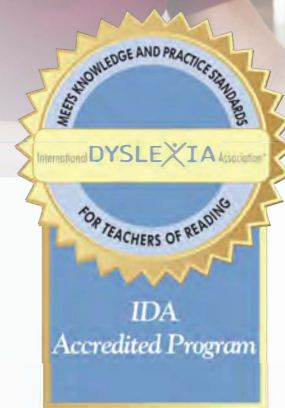


Orton-Gillingham Level 1 / Science of Reading 3-Day Course

Our course entitled "Orton-Gillingham Level 1 / Science of Reading" provides a firm definition of what the Science of Reading is, what it is not, and how all teachers and administrative staff can understand its potential to transform reading instruction. It provides a practical solution to what so many teachers are missing: how to teach struggling readers how to read.



The course is designed for classroom teachers, school administrators, Special Education teachers, literacy coaches, tutors, speech & language therapists, ELL teachers, and even parents.
